# Cannon Beach Arts Association Summer Art Camp Course Descriptions

## Avian Illustration -

### Taking Wing

(for 4th-8th graders)

Teacher: Sally Lackaff

Delve into the nature and fascination of birds while developing variations on the art of illustrating through unconventional methods. Bring your love of birds and the natural world. We will spend as much time outdoors as the weather allows.



## Bookbinding/Printmaking

Teacher: Barbara Temple Ayres

Make your own hard-bound book covered with paper you decorate using simple off-press printmaking techniques using rubber stamps, bubbles, chalk, and marbling.

## Dance Team 2008

Teacher: C.C. Siboney

Choose your favorite dance style from ballet to hip hop to folk dancing. Learn new moves and together we'll create our own dance routine to perform at the end of the week. Wear comfortable clothes.

## Expressive Painting

### With Wax

(for 6th-8th graders)

Teacher: Susan Simon

A 2,000 year old method of creating magical, transparent paintings using powdered pigments, oil sticks, collage, a heat source and beeswax.

## Weaving

Teacher: Mary Zukin

We will explore a few techniques of weaving. Each artist will weave on a back-strap loom and we will experiment with cordage (rope) made from nettle or rafia.

## Fun with Fabric

### Painting

Teacher: Lark Miller

Discover the magic of sun printing. Use specialized paints and markers to create fanciful works of art on fabric, including a hand-painted T-shirt, decorative banners and much more.

## Wear Your Art!

Teacher: Emily Thomas

Create a wearable piece of art every day. Make paper hats, mark up some shoes, paint and tie dye a shirt, dress it all up with jewelry you create. We will get inspiration from recycled objects. Show it all off at a fashion show the last day!

## Art Docents Needed

If you would like the opportunity to become more involved in the local arts community, the Cannon Beach Gallery is currently seeking art docents.

The gallery provides an important venue for emerging and professional artists from the region. A non-profit organization, the gallery is run primarily by a volunteer staff. This is a great opportunity for artists and students residing on the beach for the summer to contribute to the burgeoning arts community of

Cannon Beach, as well as long time residents. Students will receive work experience in the arts field while meeting artists and visitors to the area. Artists interested in volunteering their time have the added advantage of being able to show their original artwork on the gallery's Volunteer Wall, as well as participating in the annual Docents Show during the month of December.

A minimal time commitment is all that is required. Docents are asked to fill in two three hour shifts twice a month. The shifts are broken up between 10-1 am and 1-4 pm Thursday - Mondays. Docents can also take one entire day for the month. If there is enough of a response to the call for volunteers, the Cannon Beach Gallery may expand its summer hours to seven days a week. In May, the CBAA participated in Cannon Beach's



Spring Unveiling with Cory Burnett's conceptual installation, (L)EDGE. Cory Burnett was the 2007 recipient of the Individual Artist Grant, which the CBAA awards each year in conjunction with the City of Cannon Beach to a



local artist, musician, performer, or writer. The (L)EDGE show was accompanied by a juried show selected by Betsy Millard, the former Executive Director of the Contemporary Art Museum in St Louis.

**A Personal Language**

In June, the CB Gallery hosted a group exhibition of Astoria artists with Roger Hayes acting as both curator and the featured artist. Hayes selected Jessica Schleif, Shannon Meeker, David Plechl, and Philip Johnson for the subtle cues and nods they give each other's work. In Hayes opinion, all of the artists share a common approach, typical of the North Coast art scene: a subjective process that cues the observer to a personal language.

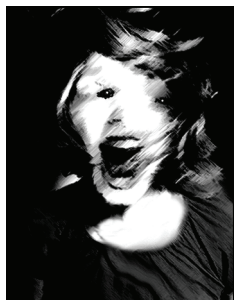

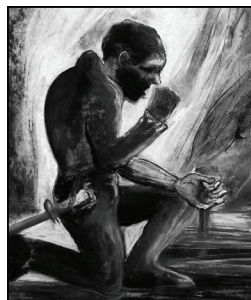
**Figures and Personalities**

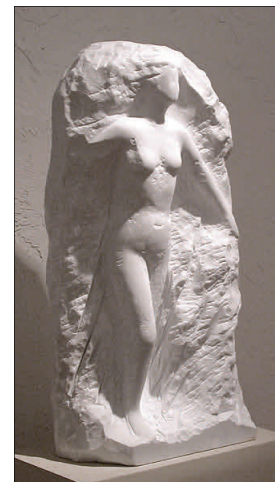
humanity, to create an image of the intangible." The exhibit runs July 3—28.
