Take a little Time Out Tuesdays this summer to explore the arts. Right after the Farmers' Market closes gallery visitors will be treated to theater performances, author book-readings, or artists' discussions of their techniques. Sponsored by the Cannon Beach Arts Association in partnership with Clatsop Community College Arts and Letters Faculty the series offers locals and visitors alike time and a place for an interesting break from summer's sometimes-hectic pace.

Jewelry Artist Sharon Amber Donates Pendant

Cannon Beach jewelry designer Sharon Amber has donated a one-of-a-kind original piece that will be raffled off at the Stormy Weather Arts Festival to benefit the CBAA Individual Artist Grant.

The pendant features a large Australian Boulder Opal in sea green and blue tones with ruby red highlights. The artist set it in a 14-karat yellow gold cast design featuring a fiddlehead fern and has it presented on a cord. The piece is valued at \$2000.

Sharon is a member of the Arts Association and has exhibited many pieces throughout the years. She is also a past participant on the Sculpture Without Walls event held annually in Cannon Beach, of which CBAA has been a sponsor. *Tickets cost \$2 each or three for \$5 and are available at the gallery.*



Love Theater? Desserts? Wine? CBAA's August Event Is For You!

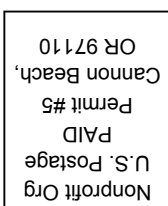
Wine, laughter, witty comedy, desserts and conversation will all be had August 21 and 22 when Cannon Beach Arts Association reprises Spring Unveiling's smash hit "After Magritte" and adds to it!

Producer-director Merrill Lynn Taylor's off-the-wall production geared to the intimacy of our gallery had people lined up outside the door for all 10 shows and left others looking for a way to see it. Award-winning playwright Tom Stoppard's 30-minute funny, challenging, wacky farce brought Taylor and cast raves: "One of the most delightful half hours I have had" -- "A great laugh . . . it makes you think!"-- "Bravo to you all!"

Now director and cast and CBAA offer four special show events -- two Saturday and two Sunday -- to raise funds for the arts association.

Here's how it works: Playgoers start with wine and special appetizers at the gallery, followed by the 30-minute performance. Afterward wine and delicious desserts will be served while playgoers get to discuss with the director and actors the fun and the challenges of creating a theatrical production in the close-up setting of our gallery. Each day playgoers to the early show gather at 5:30 with a 6 p.m. show; late show ticket-holders arrive at 8 with an 8:30 p.m. performance. Just \$25 per person covers it all.

Reserve early by calling the gallery! This was a hugely popular play production and audiences are limited to 20 people per performance. You can even book an entire event for a large group to celebrate some special occasion -- your own "command performance"!
